Handicaps News

This month we provide you with a broad overview of the current GolfRSA Handicap Rules and then highlight the changes planned to be introduced in October 2019, followed by the final changes to be introduced in January 2020 – to comply with the World Handicap System launch.

GolfRSA: Current system Valid scores World Handicap System: January 2020

If the score differential is 7- to 10-shots lower than the Handicap Index, then the player's differentials and Handicap Index are reduced by - 1.0. If the score is greater than 10 shots below the Handicap Index, then the Handicap Index is reduced by -2.0

If the player's new Handicap Index is greater than 3 strokes higher than their lowest Handicap Index in the last 12 months, then the increase above 3 shots is limited to 50% of the increase.

The Hard Cap is triggered after the soft cap has been applied and limits the increase in a Handicap Index to no more than 5 shots from their lowest Handicap Index in the last 12 months

The PCC calculation adjusts the player's differential for the round according to a statistical calculation to adjust for a variation in playing conditions due to weather conditions, course conditions and course setup.




The Locker Room

:Golf Rules:

You have all been in the position before, where you've tee'd off and reached your ball only to discover that there is another ball right next to yours... The question is, how do you go about identifying your golf ball, without incurring a penalty? Here is how one go's about it:

How to Identify Ball

A player's ball at rest may be identified in any one of these ways:

- By the player or anyone else seeing a ball come to rest in circumstances where it is known to be the player's ball.
- By seeing the player's identifying mark on the ball (see Rule 6.3a).
- By finding a ball with the same brand, model, number and condition as the player's ball in an area where the player's ball is expected to be (**but** this does not apply if an identical ball is in the same area and there is no way to know which one is the player's ball).

If a player's provisional ball cannot be distinguished from his or her original ball, see <u>Rule 18.3c(2)</u>.

: Ball Accidentally Moved in Trying to Find or Identify It :

There is no penalty if the player's ball is accidentally moved by the player, opponent or anyone else while trying to find or identify it. If this happens, the ball must be replaced on its original spot (which if not known must be estimated) (see <u>Rule 14.2</u>). In doing so:

- If the ball was on, under or against any immovable obstruction, integral object, boundary object or growing or attached natural object, the ball must be replaced on its original spot on, under or against such object (see Rule 14.2c).
- If the ball was covered by sand, the original lie must be re-created and the ball must be replaced in that lie (see Rule 14.2d(1). But the player may leave a small part of the ball visible when doing so.
